FOR DISCUSSION:

Colossians 1:1-8

1. Paul is giving thanks in the opening of his letter. How do we practice giving thanks for people in our lives, and in particular with those in the church family? What can we learn from Paul in this regard?
2. Talk about the role of love in this passage.
3. If you have time: We tend to gloss over the triad—faith, hope, and love—because we've heard the words so often. But they are the marks of real spiritual life. Look up these passages and discover how the three words (faith, hope and love) are related to one another and are manifested in a believer's life—Romans 5:2-5; Galatians 5:5-6; 1 Thesalonians 1:2-3, 5:8; Hebrews 10:22-24 and 1 Peter 1:3-5, 22.
4. One author writes, "Heresies (such as the one at Colosse) are local and harmful, but truth is universal and helpful." What are common universal claims we believe today? What are the commonalities for such claims?

THE KING AND THE COLLECTIVE:
CHRIST, CREATION, COSMOS

¹ From Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother, ² to the saints, the faithful brothers and sisters in Christ, at Colossae. Grace and peace to you from God our Father!

Paul's Thanksgiving and Prayer for the Church

³ We always give thanks to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴ since we heard about your faith in Christ Jesus and the love that you have for all the saints.

⁵ Your faith and love have arisen from the hope laid up for you in heaven, which you have heard about in the message of truth, the gospel ⁶ that has come to you. Just as in the entire world this gospel is bearing fruit and growing, so it has also been bearing fruit and growing among you from the first day you heard it and understood the grace of God in truth. ⁷ You learned the gospel from Epaphras, our dear fellow slave—a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf—⁸ who also told us of your love in the Spirit.

The message of Jesus is universal, inclusive, and grows plant-like and gives us a way of living that is hope-filled.
